

series a year and a half to two years ago, they've made 74 episodes featuring typically two to four types of macaroni

and cheese.
"I thought we'd go to the supermarket, buy a few boxe and get 10 to 15 shows out of it," said Hunt. "I've been keep coming out with more."
For the most part, they separate the macaroni and

His overall favorites these days in the classic category: Kraft's Three Cheese and one from HBB, a store brand out of Texas. For the deluxe category, a new contender takes the prize Cracker Barret ackes the prize Cracker Barret and Cheese Dinner. Most of the worst ones are in the vegan and gluten-free category, he said, adding, "If you're going to go through the trouble of eating vegan, why eat boxed mac and



cheese?" Before there was BoxMac, Before there was BoxMac, Hunt, Frain and a few other friends from the Westport/ Tiverton area started making feature length films under their Red Gow Entertainment brand. After deciding it took too long to make a fea-ture film, they made some You'lube videos called Junt's Cart. When they moved on to the BoxMac series, it caught

on with fans. The videos average about 4,000 views with fans in all parts of the world, said Hunt. Like trading cards for the mac and cheese obsessed, Hunt has a collection of flat-tened, empty boxes of macatened, empty boxes of maca-roni and cheese in languages both familiar and foreign to show for their efforts. The Dundery Brook trail is not long (just a little over two miles round-trip), but it is beautiful, especially under a blanket of snow! In mild weather (with no snow or ice) this part of the trail is wheelchair- or stroller-accessible, but with a coating of snow on top, the path is more suitable for skis, snow shoes, or good hiking boots. At the edge of the forest, the boardwalk leads out onto the boardwalk leads out onto a meadow-path (the Nature Conservancy's website says it is an old cart-path). To the left, the preserve borders on the property of Bumblebee Farm (the preserve is also known as "Bumblebee Preserve"), which is quite pic-turesque, but whose property is off-limits to hikers. To the right, the path fol-

is off-limits to hikers.

To the right, the path fol-lows along the eastern edge of Bumblebee Pond, which hosts swampland and swamp plants, like cattails, a very important plant for nesting red-winged blackbirds and marsh were, and also imporred-winged biackbirds and marsh wrens, and also impor-tant to the frogs and sala-manders who lay their eggs amongst them, and other ani-mals who both eat them and utilize them for cover. As I was there on a snowy day, I did not see any nesting

— thanks to the snow — to see the prints of some deer that had passed by, as well as evidence of the hunt by some bird of prey (most likely a hawk) of some small mammal (wing markings and blood stains in the snow).

The path along the shore of Bumblebee pond is very pleasant — the elongation of this end of the pond making it feel as if you are following a river. Eventually, you leave the pond side and follow the path

into an open meadow, whice offers a wonderful wide sky oners a woncernu wice sky and at its edge some impres-sively large trees, and then the path continues down a lane which is edged by mixed ever-greens (holly and juniper), until once again you reach the edge of the preserve's limits, and it is time to turn around for the return trip,
While the Dundery Brook
Trail does not provide the
kind of spectacle that you
might get on a mountain top
or at the sea's edge, it does
offer up the romantic charm
of a forest and meadow lane
that seem as if they have
hardly changed over the
